

ENGLAND'S GREAT WEST WAY IS OFFICIALLY OPEN

The Great West Way, a new touring route from London to Bristol, is declared officially open

The Great West Way, a multi-modal route that can be travelled by bike, road, rail, canal or on foot, making it the first of its kind, is declared officially open today, 5 November.

The new touring route travels through six counties from London to Bristol and encompasses 500 miles of navigable routes along the Thames, Kennet & Avon Canal, the Great Western Railway, the A4 and numerous walking and cycling trails.

However, it is explored, the Great West Way will take travellers through some of England's most picturesque countryside, thriving market towns and chocolate box villages. It covers three UNESCO sites (Kew Gardens, Stonehenge/Avebury and Bath), three Areas of Outstanding Natural Beauty (the Chilterns, the Cotswolds and North Wessex Downs) and England's most iconic attractions, including Hampton Court Palace, Windsor Castle, Stonehenge and Bath's Roman Baths. Combined with a plethora of pubs, tearooms, breweries, vineyards and Michelin-starred restaurants, the Great West Way offers overseas and domestic visitors a quintessentially English experience.

Great West Way Director, David Andrews said:

"This new touring route, the first of its kind, joins-up many of England's most iconic attractions, but also enables and encourages visitors to venture off the beaten track, explore more of the region and discover a whole gamut of quintessentially English experiences, all within one trip."

Visitors can create their own itinerary by visiting <u>GreatWestWay.co.uk</u>, a new website which offers an interactive map, insider tips, an events calendar and a planning tool to generate bespoke tours. This includes the option to add day excursions to other places of interest that are accessible from the route, such as Salisbury, Stourhead and Cheddar Gorge. Bristol Airport and Great Western Railway are fully-fledged partners in the project and will ensure the route is as accessible as possible for those travelling by train or air.

There are also bookable itineraries offered by official Great West Way tour operators, such as a four-day guided cycling/walking tour with Active England, costing from \$1599 (£1209) for three nights' four-star accommodation, bike hire and coach transfers. The itinerary includes Windsor Castle, Avebury and Stonehenge, the Kennet and Avon Canal, Bath, Highgrove and The Cotswolds..

In November 2015, the Government announced a £40 million Discover England Fund; an unprecedented opportunity for English tourism.
